The Implications of Legalizing Marijuana - All You Need to Know

Hour 1:

- **Dr. Souders** will be discussing some of the issues and concerns that were present in the development of Washington's efforts to legalize marijuana usage.
 - She will address some of the science and rationale behind the per se laws. Why 5ng and what is the effect of this quantity of active marijuana upon the body? What is the meaning and effect of the other metabolites which will be present in a properly conducted blood test? How should toxicological results be interpreted regarding medical marijuana users and what might be different about the effects of marijuana on medical versus recreational users?
 - Dr. Souders is a talented and highly-skilled expert scientific and medical courtroom witness and medical doctor having worked with some of the best criminal defense attorneys in WA. Having presented at both local and national seminars and conferences, her presentation will be of interest to both prosecution and defense attorneys and to everyone who is curious about this legislation.

Hour 2:

- Join trained Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Battle Ground Police **Sergeant Tim Wilson** while he demonstrates and comments upon the proper testing procedures for the Washington State Standardized DRE evaluations. (He will not be accepting questions.)
- Vancouver DUI defense attorney **Andrew Wheeler** will be addressing some of the major changes that I-502 brought into the world of DUI defense.

Hour 3:

What are some of the effects of the new Recreational Marijuana Law in light of the Federal Government's
classification of marijuana as a controlled substance? How does the interaction of federal preemption and
supremacy affect this state law? Jeff Ott will examine the federal government's powers of legislation over
the states in regards to marijuana laws and how it has responded through coercive action and AG
enforcement.

Hour 4:

Ethics Panel Discussion: Hon. Richard Melnick, Eric Hoffman & Jeff Ott

• What exposure do we have as practitioners when helping our client navigate the legal gray area that is marijuana law? The focus of the panel will concern the ethical and legal implications of representing a client interested in, or currently, distributing marijuana. What is required to meet zealous and competent representation and the distinctions between advising and assisting?



Dr. Jennifer Souders is an Anesthesiologist practicing Interventional Pain Medicine in Mountlake Terrace, WA. She is board certified in anesthesiology, a licensed MD in Washington, and was a Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine at the UW School of Medicine with over 20 years on the faculty. Dr. Souders completed residency training in Anesthesiology and completed a joint fellowship in Anesthesiology and Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine.

Her areas of research expertise include the physiology of the lungs, the exchange of materials between the lungs and the blood, the physiology of air in the vasculature, and the risks of adverse perioperative outcomes. Some areas of clinical interest are pain management, thoracic and cardiovascular anesthesiology, pharmacology & toxicology, substance abuse and addiction.

She is President of Souders Independent Medical Consultations, PLLC and consults on medical and scientific issues, including medical aspects of civil and criminal legal cases.
